#### Notes to Compiled Financial Information Year Ended December 31, 2022

#### 1. BASIS OF ACCOUNTING

The basis of accounting applied in the preparation of the statement of financial position of Business Improvements Areas of British Columbia as at December 31, 2022, and the statements of revenues and expenditures and changes in net assets for the year then ended is on the historical cost basis and reflects cash transactions with the addition of:

- · Accounts payable and accrued liabilities.
- Deferred revenue recorded when received and brought into revenue over the period it relates to.

#### 2. PURPOSE OF THE ORGANIZATION

Business Improvements Areas of British Columbia (the "organization") is a not-for-profit organization incorporated provincially under the Society Act of British Columbia. As a registered charity the organization is exempt from the payment of income tax under Section 149(1) of the Income Tax Act.

The organization operates to provide leadership that will champion strong, vibrant and successful downtowns, main streets and commerical districts throughout British Columbia. It is a membership-based organization reliant on dues and fundraising from its activities. It's main purpose is to assist and promote BIAs and BIA movement in British Columbia.
